Anxiety, Worry, and Fear...Three Enemies of Believers A Study Outline

- I. Anxiety and worry have been a plague all through mankind's history.
- II. Both concepts are closely related to *fear*... especially fear of the unknown.
- III. Many of us grew up under an aura of fear, worry, and anxiety.
- IV. Fear of other people is exploited and promoted by many. Satan rules through this fear.
 - **A. Governments.** The huge colossus of power that sits over people, gaining obeisance through fear of recrimination for disobedience.
 - 1. Nebuchadnezzar and the three captive Hebrews (Daniel 3:1-6)
 - 2. Ancient Egypt and the Israelites (Exodus 1:8-16)
 - B. Parents and family. May rule with rigor and demand respect rather than deserve it.
 - 1. Adam and Eve (Genesis 3:16)
 - 2. Unconverted mates (I Corinthians 7:12-15)

C. Religious leaders.

- 1. Diotrephes (III John 1:9)
- 2. Pharisees (Matthew 23:1-4, 13-14)
- 3. Worldwide Church of God

D. Other situations.

1. Abram and Pharaoh (Genesis 12:11-13; 20:2-11)

V. Many have thus attained a "fear addiction," much like addictions to drugs, alcohol, or other things, since it has become a conditioned, habitual response since before they can remember. The bonds of "fear addiction" must be broken and replaced by new habits patterned after God's Spirit in us.

VI. God's intention: fear Him, not men.

- **A. Fear God only.** [*fear = yir 'ah*, "fear or reverence; translated fear, dread"].
 - 1. Proverbs 1:7; 9:10
 - 2. Job 28:28
 - 3. Ecclesiastes 12:13
 - 4. Psalm 111:10
- **B.** Fear of men is dangerous. [*fear* = *charadah*, "fear or anxiety; translated exceedingly, fear, quaking, trembling"].
 - 1. Proverbs 29:25
- VII. Exercise the spiritual gifts and cast off the fear of men.
 - A. Rejoice, fear and be anxious for nothing, and pray for everything (Philippians 4:4-7).
 - B. Think only upon God and His nature (Philippians 4:8-9).
 - C. Be content with what you have (Philippians 4:10-13).
 - D. Express Christ's love towards Him and our brethren (I John 4:18-21).
 - E. Cast your burden on Yahweh (Psalm 55:22; Matthew 6:25-34; I Peter 5:6-7).
